A Pledge of Solidarity

PREAMBLE

We, as a cohort of members from various faith-based organizations serving northern Virginia and Washington D.C., as well as individual practitioners of faith and spirituality, join together in this pledge, having completed the first phase of a profound interfaith journey together.

Over the past year and a half, we have visited one another's sacred spaces - mutually offering and receiving one another in hospitality within our places of spiritual gathering. We have shared meals together and become aware of the depth of meaning behind some of the facets of our community life and religious calendars. In sharing these intimate experiences, we have witnessed each other's humanity, goodness, and kindness.

We have learned about individual spiritual journeys from members of our various faith communities, and we have discovered a shared, deeply human search for community and belonging. We also discovered a shared fire in our bellies for divine or deeper connection. In learning what people love and value in their faiths, we have sparked our own desire for greater understanding.
